The results show that Christopher's reading ability is currently well below the expected level for their age group. With targeted support, there are good opportunities for them to build essential reading skills.

Christopher is placed at **percentile 5**, which means their reading ability is significantly below the average for children in the same school year.

Christopher's average reading speed was 75 words per minute, which suggests that decoding - the ability to recognize and read words - is not yet automatic and requires focused practice.

In terms of reading comprehension, Christopher answered 7 out of 12 questions correctly. This suggests that they understand the content well and are able to reflect on and reason about what they read. Continuing to read a variety of texts and discussing them will help them further develop their comprehension skills.

How does Christopher approach a text?

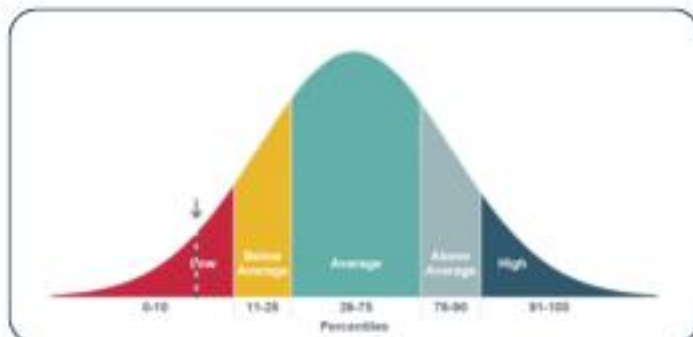
Below are visualisations of Christopher's eye movements during reading. Circles mark where the eyes paused to process text, and lines trace the movements across the page. This pattern offers insights into flow, focus, and reading strategies for comprehension.

How can you support at home?



Read aloud together daily - repetition and support with decoding are especially helpful at this stage.



Talk about what you read: What happened? What do they think will happen next.



Be patient and encouraging - every small step counts.
